IoMET Cookies Policy Last updated 27 May 2019

1. What is a cookie?

A cookie is a file placed on your computer, smartphone or tablet (hereafter "**Terminal**") when you visit a site or view an advert, subject to your own selection in this regard.

Its purpose is to collect information about your navigation and to forward appropriate services to your Terminal. Cookies are administered by your internet browser and only the issuer of the cookie is able to read or modify the information it contains.

2. Which types of cookies do we collect and for what purposes?

When you consult the website <u>https://pro.iomet.fr</u> (hereafter the "**Site**"), the following cookies are placed on your terminal.

Cookies required to navigate the Site

Nutergia places the cookies required for you to be able to navigate the Pro.iomet space and the Site. These cookies enable you to:

- Access the reserved and personal areas of the Site (PHP5ESSID)
- Memorise the appropriate site language (il8next)

Without these cookies, the Site cannot be used normally. They are retained for 11 months.

Cookies used to produce statistics

Google Analytics places cookies on your Terminal for statistical purposes. These cookies require your consent.

You may adjust the settings of these cookies directly from your browser's settings in accordance with Article 4 below – "How to manage your cookies".

3. What is the legal basis of collecting cookies?

The placement and collection of cookies is mainly based on the user's consent. You must therefore be able to express and modify your consent free of charge and at any time via the selections you are offered by your browser.

4. How to manage your cookies?

Multiple cookie management options are offered to you.

By adjusting your browser settings

You can modify these settings by configuring your browser so that the cookies are recorded on your Terminal or rejected, either systematically or by issuer of the cookies. You may also configure your browser to accept or refuse the cookies offered to you on an ad hoc basis and before it can be recorded on your Terminal.Each browser is configured differently regarding the management of your cookies and your selections. It is described in your browser's help menu.
